英 語

問題 I 以下の英文は、ある短編小説の冒頭部分です。以下の英文を読み、 設問 $1. \sim 13$. に答えなさい。

He loved them so much he would sometimes, during the warm evenings, lay them all out on the floor to look at. [A] He

would examine each piece with love and care. Only he, he was sure, could understand their true value.

He lived alone in an old house which looked over the Singapore River. It was close to the antique shops which sold the old things he loved. He would often look in the shop windows at the beautiful things he could not afford to buy. Not on his salary. It made him angry to think that such things would end up in the home of some fat tourist who could not possibly see their (6) as he could.

It wasn't fair.

Harry was looking forward to today. (7) A very large old grave had been discovered while some forest land was being cleared. The university had been given the job of examining the grave and the things inside it. The grave was inside a big stone room which seemed to have been built for it.
